

## CNIB LIBRARY'S COMPACT CASSETTE COLLECTION

This catalogue supplement lists the new releases of talking books that are produced and distributed by the CNIB Library for the Blind. In addition to the growing number of Canadian titles recorded in our CNIB studios, the collection contains many titles recorded for the Library of Congress by agencies such as The American Foundation for the Blind, The American Printing House for the Blind and Eva-Tone, as well as titles from various other sources. (Agency abbreviations and date of tape production listed after print and publication data).

**Note for libraries, bookstores, and individuals outside Canada:** Please look for the Canadian flag icon in this catalogue. This icon denotes any book that is produced by the CNIB Library and available for you to purchase.

### ACCESS

Access to the CNIB Talking Book Collection requires compliance with Section 32 (1) of the *Canadian Copyright Act*. Libraries and other information service providers are required to verify a user's disability in accordance with the definition provided for "perceptual disability" in the Act. "Perceptual disability" is defined as a disability that prevents or inhibits a person from reading or hearing a literary, musical, dramatic or artistic work in its original format, and includes such a disability resulting from: a) a severe or total impairment of sight or hearing or the inability to focus or move one's eyes; b) the inability to hold or manipulate a book; or c) an impairment relating to comprehension.

We want to ensure that copyright owners are respected and that this service, so generously supported by authors, publishers, donors and volunteers, is not jeopardized.
