In 2021, CNIB Lake Joe celebrated 60 years of bringing the magic of camp to Canadians with sight loss. With innovative virtual programming and fun celebrations, new in-person programming and new amenities, we'd like to thank everyone who celebrated this amazing milestone with us!

In 2021/22, CNIB Lake Joe had just under 2,000 visits:

- **1,646** participant visits 1,546 in CNIBLakeJoe@Home virtual programming and 100 in-person for Holiday Weeks.
- **32** attended the Guide Dog Users of Canada AGM.
- **34** attended CNIB, Vision Loss Rehabilitation Canada and Deafblind Community Services events and meetings.
- 27 special guests from Canada and the United States attended the Synthetic Turf Council's dedication ceremony for the new soccer pitch and mini-golf course.
- More than **250** physically distanced donors, sponsors, participants, and volunteers came together for the wildly successful CNIB Muskoka: Dock-to-Dock: Poker Run fundraising event.



Together, we celebrated our 60th anniversary all year long through online festivities including:

- Our monthly <u>60th Anniversary Saturday Series</u> virtual program
- A special 60th Anniversary video
- A new <u>CNIB Lake Joe Historical Timeline</u>
- An AMI documentary called <u>Ripples CNIB Lake Joe</u>





2021/22 NEW Program Highlights

Who could have imagined that in our 60th anniversary year, CNIB Lake Joe would **go** hybrid!

With COVID-19 continuing to impact in-person programming, we maintained a full year of **CNIBLakeJoe@Home virtual programs** for adults and children, launching new programs like learning "French with Friends" and expanding the wildly popular Camp-in-a-Box programs.



Here is a photo of virtual camper Kyle, excited to open his Camp-in-a-Box complete with musical instruments and everything he needed for a do-ityourself Halloween-at-Home party! He and 32 other children and youth scared up lots of fun and laughs together!

People of all ages with sight loss kept connected year-round with CNIBLakeJoe@Home programming:

- 1,545 participant visits in 22
 CNIBLakeJoe@Home programs, participating in 4,101 program hours
- 16% of participants were from outside of Ontario (a 77% increase from last year)
- 37% were children and youth

As spring turned into summer, staff brainstormed ways to bring people together onsite safely. Exploring CNIB Lake Joe's history, we discovered that it was originally known as the "Canadian National Institute for the Blind Lake Joseph Adjustment Training and Holiday Centre." Quite a mouthful, but the "Holiday Centre" part triggered the idea to create a new type of "Holiday Week" program!

In August, we formally launched three **Holiday Week** offerings and welcomed people back to CNIB Lake Joe during the pandemic. A reduced number of guests attended with their friends and family and, with thorough health and safety protocols in place, chose their own adventures.

With border closures and travel restrictions leaving many Canadians without a guide dog, CNIB Lake Joe partnered with CNIB Guide Dogs and Vision Loss Rehabilitation Canada (VLRC) to pilot another new program: **Getting Ready for a Guide Dog**. While people waited to be matched with their next guide dog, staff from CNIB Guide Dogs and VLRC used CNIB Lake Joe – and nearby Parry Sound – to update and enhance clients' orientation and mobility skills. Thirty-two guests and staff attended.

CNIB Muskoka 60th Anniversary Weekend Celebration



We were thrilled to be joined by CNIB Muskoka Dock-to-Dock: Poker Run celebrity hosts Ben Mulroney, Joan Kelley Walker (returning emcee) and Rod Black, August 14, 2021!

CNIB Lake Joe hosted its official opening celebration on July 21,1961, and formally opened its doors to campers on August 17, 1961. Sixty years later, the CNIB Lake Joe community celebrated this milestone over an **action-packed weekend raising \$370,000** for CNIB Lake Joe's capital redevelopment campaign! This funding enables the purchase of adaptive sports and independent living skills equipment for a new multi-purpose recreation and learning facility at CNIB Lake Joe.

As part of this anniversary weekend, CNIB Lake Joe partnered with the Antique and Classic Boat Society-Toronto (ACBS-Toronto) to operate our first-ever **CNIB Muskoka: Dock-to-Dock: Poker Run** on Saturday, August 14. Over 250 participants, including "Dock Hosts," guests, donors, sponsors and volunteers (plus **50/50 draw** ticket purchasers), raised over \$130,000 of our weekend grand total.

Through the incredible generosity of its members, the **Synthetic Turf Council (STC)** donated a fully accessible soccer pitch, mini-golf course and amenities to CNIB Lake Joe. Based in the USA, STC partnered with CNIB Lake Joe as its first-ever international Community Service Project and excavation began May 17, 2021. With a reduced number of guests onsite, workers were able to bring this exciting project to a relatively quick completion.

CNIB Lake Joe is deeply grateful to local father/son volunteer team, Roy and Mark Klementti, who spearheaded this initiative, as well as all the local businesses that generously contributed cash, product and labour.
