Over the past year, CNIB Guide Dogs has continued to grow, meeting an increasing demand for our services while ensuring every dog receives the highest standard of care and training. Thanks to you, we have made remarkable progress in strengthening our program – from advancing breeding initiatives to expanding our Canine Campus to train and match more guide dogs than ever before.

Some of this year's key milestones include:

- **1. 22** CNIB guide dogs, **seven** buddy dogs, **four** brood dogs, and **two** ambassador dogs were matched!
- **2. 56 puppies** were born in the CNIB Guide Dogs Breeding Program.
- **3.** Thanks to Hydro One, our Canine Campus got a **major electrical upgrade**, ensuring we can operate at full capacity for years to come.
- **4.** We **transformed** our indoor city with exciting new storefronts, city streets, obstacles, and multiple training zones giving our dogs the best space to prepare for the **real world.**

While these milestones highlight our progress, the true impact of your generosity is felt in the daily lives of our clients. From expert training to veterinary care, every step of a guide dog's journey is shaped by your support. A buddy dog is partnered with a child or youth who is blind or has low vision.




Ambassador Dogs

CNIB Buddy Dogs Camp @ CNIB Lake Joe offers a fun and supportive space for current buddy dog users and families on the waitlist to connect, play, and learn more about the program. The camp is designed for children and families impacted by blindness, providing a safe and engaging environment for all.

In its third year, the camp brought together buddy dog partnerships from across the country – along with waitlisted families – for an unforgettable week at CNIB Lake Joe, held from August 19–24.

Children and their parents were invited to a four-day summer retreat where they had the opportunity to connect with other kids who are blind or have low vision. These incredible connections helped them form meaningful friendships, cultivate independence, and create lasting memories together.



Thanks to your generosity, Heidi and Amy have found each other. And together, they are unstoppable.




Looking Ahead

The Future of CNIB Guide Dogs

As we look to the future of CNIB Guide Dogs, we are committed to strengthening our program and ensuring we can meet the increasing demand for guide dogs across Canada. Our focus is on two critical areas: the Howard & Delores Beck Puppy Development Centre and the final capital needs of the CNIB Canine Campus.

The Howard & Delores Beck Puppy
Development Centre is a game-changer in
our ability to provide more guide dogs to
the people who need them. This state-of-theart facility will allow us to breed, whelp, and
raise puppies with the highest genetic and
health standards, ensuring a sustainable and
ethical guide dog breeding program.


By eliminating reliance on external breeders, we are securing the **long-term success** of CNIB Guide Dogs and expanding the number of Canadians we can serve. The site of the puppy development center is currently in the midst of assessments and permit approvals. At the end of October, we submitted the site plan application, and in early January, we received the first round of comments. Our team of consultants and engineers are closely reviewing and addressing the comments and making the necessary adjustments to keep the project moving forward.



Looking Ahead The Future of CNIB Guide Dogs

At our CNIB Canine Campus, we are in the final stages of completing essential upgrades, including our Indoor City, which simulates real-world environments such as streets, public transit, and everyday obstacles that guide dogs and handlers encounter. With the capacity to train **150 dogs per year**, the Canine Campus is a **cornerstone** of our program.

To fully realize these ambitions, we require additional funding to complete construction, outfit training spaces, and provide ongoing care and training for the next generation of CNIB Guide Dogs. With your support, we will ensure every Canadian who needs a guide dog can have one - **at no cost to them.**



CNIB Canine Campus is building a plane fuselage to help guide dogs and handlers safely practice air travel. It lets teams get comfortable with aisles, seating, and in-flight routines—preparing them for smoother trips.


In Memory




